WHY KONECRANES®?



He's as experienced as they come in the Service field. Over the course of 22 years at Konecranes, Jon Hentz has worked as a technician, a lead inspector, a specialist technician, a service supervisor, and a service manager. Jon was the third person to be hired in the Eliot, Maine location. The head office was in Dartmouth, Nova Scotia so Konecranes techs from Canada were coming to Maine on a quarterly basis to inspect and service the equipment of about half a dozen customers. This was how Jon became connected with Konecranes. From there, he says, "One thing led to another."

It's refreshingly honest to hear Jon explain that throughout his years at Konecranes, there have been many changes, and with many changes inevitably come many challenges. Despite the ups and downs, he credits much to the great people he's worked with.
